A Father to the Fatherless

George Muller

- Born 1805 in Prussia
- Father wanted him to be minister
- Attended a Lutheran church for years, but lived in sin
- Later said he never heard the gospel preached in that church
- Made the mistake of reading lots of Christian books, but not much Bible

How He Lived As A “Christian”

- George drank
- Partied
- Gambled
- Borrowed money with no intent to repay
- Lied
- Stole
- Cheated

“The Christian” Was Born Again

- Was “born again” in a home Bible study
- Was challenged by three senior Christians to be baptized.
- He said he was already baptized as a young child in the Episcopal Church
- Didn't see a need to be re-baptized

Scriptural Baptism

- He was asked to study:
- Acts 8:35-38: “Believe with all your heart, then be baptized.”
- Romans 6:3-5
- Baptism is the beginning of the new life.
- Did Muller show that after his first baptism?

As You Have Received The Gift

- He realized that many like himself who thought they were Christians, were really not, until they were born again.
- Decided to become a missionary to help reach others.
- He told told his plans to a pretty young girl, named Ermagarde, who he hoped he could marry.

Who Wants To Be A Missionary?

- Ermegarde's response: "whatever made you think of such a ridiculous thing.
- I could never be a missionary's wife.
- Missionaries are poor and wear drab clothes.
- George, you have a good mind. Be a doctor or lawyer. Leave the missionary job for those who have nothing better to do."

Muller The Soul-Winner

- He joined a Baptist Chapel
- In 12 months there were 65 conversions
- One conversion was of a man who threatened to kill his wife if she did not stop attending the church
- There were so many coming to the altar for salvation that it would take 3-4 hours to deal with them.

A Godly Wife

- Oct. 7th, 1830 George married a lady named Mary. She was not as pretty as Ermegarde, but she was very godly.
- George asked her to get rid of all the valuable furnishings from her family.

Much Faith

- Mary cried, but she said to her husband: “if you have that much faith, I guess that I can too.”
- “Without faith, it is impossible to please God.” Hebrews 11:6
- For he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Muller Wanted To Sow Seed

- In 1834 Muller began the “Scripture Institution For Home and Abroad”
 - During his lifetime, that Institution distributed 282,000 Bibles and 1.5 million New Testaments.

A Father of the Fatherless

- "Share your reason for wanting to start an orphan house here in Bristol," Henry Craik asked George Mueller" in 1835..
" The main purpose is to show to others that God is alive, a "Father of the fatherless," If I can provide food, shelter, and education for a few orphans solely through prayer alone, then God will be glorified."

A Passion For The Fatherless

- In April 1835 he felt called to be a missionary to orphan children. He had about 50 cents to his name.
 - The following week a missionary sent him an offering toward establishment of an orphans home
 - Two days later a man promised to give Muller 4 shillings per week “as long as the Lord provides” (faith promise).

Muller's Primary Goal

- Was not the saving of souls
- It was that God would be glorified
- “I longed to train up the orphans in the knowledge and fear of the Lord, but more importantly:
- I wanted the world to see that the orphans were taken care of by God through prayer and faith only.”

You Have Not Because Ye Ask Not

- Mr. Muller and the staff had a policy that they would never ask anyone for funds, nor would they in any way solicit funds for the orphanage.
- All needs were to be prayed for and the orphanage work would be entirely funded through faith and prayer.

Everything But Orphans

- He prayed for a place, funds, supplies and his prayers were answered.
- They advertised for orphan children, but none came.
- Mrs. Muller told George the reason there were no children was because they had prayed for everything but children.
- They prayed and God sent the children.

First Orphanage

- He rented a house, filled it; rented a second and third and filled them.
- The houses provided for 150 orphans.
- There was no more room for additional orphans without getting a bigger facility.
- Neighbors began complaining about all these noisy children to take care of.
- George Muller and staff prayed.

Larger Facility Needed

- There was a need for a larger orphanage to house 300 orphans.
- They needed to buy land to build on.
- The owner of the ideal property was asking 200 pounds per acre. Mr. Muller only had enough money to pay 120 per acre.

God Intervenes In The Affairs of Man

- Mr. Muller tried to see the owner, Mr. Hazelwood, at his work and at his home, but couldn't contact him until the next day.
- Mr. Hazelwood told Mr. Muller: I was asking 200 per acre yesterday, but I could not sleep at all last night. God kept telling me to sell my property to you for 120 pounds per acre.
- I won't make a profit, but I will sleep.

Pressed Down, Running Over

- After paying for the land, numerous donations were received in the amount of over 1700 pounds.
- The “New Orphan House” was completed with the capacity of 300 (140 girls, 80 boys, and 80 infants).
- June 1849 the orphans moved into their new facility on Ashley Down.

Cast Your Bread Upon The Waters

- Besides monetary donations, there were many donations of valuable things.
- For all the things that Mary had given up to go into the ministry, many times more were given to the orphanage for the ministry.
- “Give and it shall be given unto you...”

The Ministry Blessed

- As Muller increased the number of orphans, he built orphanage numbers 3, 4 and 5.
- They were nearly out of funds.
- They held prayer meetings for 35 days straight.
- On the 36th day, a huge offering was received. Enough to cover one year's expenses.

God Uses The Base And Lowly

- 98% of the donors were people that Mr. Muller had no knowledge of.
- One widow lady sold her home and gave all of the proceeds to the orphanage.
- Mr. Muller requested a meeting with her and asked her to take the money back as she might need it, being a widow. She refused and said it is of the Lord.

A Donation From Australia

- From a pastor in Australia, Mr. Muller received this letter: “Dear sir, I enclose an offering from a young man in my church. He was addicted to smoking and decided to save the money he would have spent on smoking and send it for the orphans.”

The Widows Mite

- A poor crippled woman living far from Bristol began sending one penny per month to the orphanage.
- Later the Lord blessed her and she was able to send much more.
- With one of her offerings she sent this note:

Giving Is Living

- “Give, give, give...be ever giving. If you are living, you will be giving. Those who are not giving, are not living.”

The Power of Faith and Prayer

- In Nov. 1844, Mr. Muller began praying for the conversion of five people.
- After 18 months of prayer, one was saved.
- After 5 years the second was saved.
- After 11 years of prayer the 3rd was saved.
- “After 35 years of praying these two friends from my youth, have not yet been saved, but they will be.”

A Godly Woman Praised

- After nearly 40 years of marriage, Mary Muller died of rheumatic fever.
- It was the largest funeral Bristol had ever seen.
- Hundreds of church people and 1200 present and former orphans marched behind the casket.
- Hundreds of letters were received from orphans who had lost “their mother.”

Satan Attacks God's Works

- His orphanage Institution has been called one of the most remarkable in history.
- God so blessed.
- And Mr. Muller endured so much. Many lies were spread about how the orphans were abused and nearly starved to death.
- The truth was just the opposite.

Blessings of Christianity

- Compared to all orphanages in England, Mr. Muller's had the lowest death rate.
- Those who had grown up and left the orphanage had an overwhelming praise for the way they were treated.

Faith In The Future

- Mr. Muller's last sermon preached at Bethesda Chapel, March 1898:
- His text: II Corinthians 5:1?
- “For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were destroyed, we have a building of God, an house not made of hands, eternal in the heavens.”
- Mr. Muller quietly went to be with the Lord March 10th, in his 93rd year.

Give Tribute Where Tribute Is Due

- All the businesses in Bristol closed.
- Windows were draped with black curtains.
- Thousands lined the streets to watch the casket go from the Orphanage to the Chapel
- 1500 orphans marched in the procession
- 7000 stood at the cemetery

True Happiness

- During 69 years of ministry, Mr. Muller was noted for being exceptionally happy.
- He was asked why he was so happy.
- His answer:
 1. He had a good conscience toward God.
 2. He loved and read the scriptures.
 3. He lived very simply and frugally.
 4. He was a very hard worker all his life.

What Happens To Orphans

- “A father to the fatherless”
 - A census taken in England in 1851 showed the following statistics:
 - Orphans in the 39 orphanages in all of England numbered 3,764
 - Orphans in prison in England 6,000

Rescue The Perishing

- The London Daily Telegraph wrote this about George Muller:
- “He robbed the cruel streets of thousands of victims, the jails of thousands of felons, and the poor houses of thousands of waifs.”
- And how did this humble man do these amazing things.
- By prayer and faith.

The Lord, Not George Muller

- Mr. Muller had always insisted that it was not his orphanage, but it was the Lord's.
 - A new leader took over. His name was Mr. Bergin.
-

The Lord, Not George Muller

- Mr. Bergin wanted to do something special for the 2,000 orphans, so he asked the staff to pray for 1 banana for each orphan.
 - Many days later, an importer came to the orphanage and said they had 4,000 extra bananas and wanted to know if the orphanage could use them.
 - The Father gave 2 bananas per orphan.

Know Them By Their Fruit

- During his 31 years heading the orphanage:
- 10,024 orphans lived at the orphanage.
- 2,813 orphans left the institution as believers. (roughly 3 out of 10)
- Subsequent letters and contacts indicated that hundreds more became born-again after leaving the orphanage.

New Ministry Focus

- At age 70, Mr. Muller felt called to be a missionary.
- He traveled and spoke as a missionary for the next 17 years.
- As he was traveling about he came in contact with many who had grown up and left his orphanage.

Give and It Shall Be Given Unto You

- Hudson Taylor, missionary to China and his wife, were out of food and out of money.
 - Mail was only received rarely, but that day came a letter.
 - It was from The Orphan's Home, Bristol England
 - It was a large love offering to take care of Hudson and Mrs. Taylor.
 - Muller gave thousands to missionaries.
-

His Fruit Remained

- In England Charles Haddon Spurgeon attended Mr. Muller's meetings.
- In California he was reintroduced to one of his orphans who was being greatly used of the Lord in personal soul-winning.
- In Washington D.C. President Hayes invited Mr. Muller to the White House for a visit.

Be Not Weary In Well Doing

- In addition to managing the orphanages, he also pastored the Bethesda Chapel.
 - At the time of his death, the Chapel had a membership of over 2,000.

Real Faith

- At no time did he have funds to take care of the orphans for more than 3 days, yet he never turned down taking in an orphan, if there was room.
- Over the years in excess of 7 million pounds came in to construct and maintain the orphanage facilities and needs.
- No orphan ever missed a meal for lack of funds.

Faith and Trust In Your Father

- In eleven years, he had received over five thousand answers to prayer.
 - He declares that his countenance never looks sad or anxious when in need, as he considers that would be dishonoring to God, and inconsistent with a perfect trust in the heavenly father.

Ask Your Heavenly Father

- “The support of his orphanage cost \$230,000 annually. The milk-bill amounts to \$10,000 yearly!
- He never asked a human being for a pence!
- He made it his uniform rule to go to his heavenly father in prayer, and ask Him for all his needs.

The Father Works Through Others

- In prayer Mueller asked his Heavenly Father for all needed supplies.
- The Father moved men to give it; some giving out of their abundant wealth, and some out of their poverty. He has received as high as \$45,000. A principle of his has been never to contract a debt in connection with his orphanage.

Our Father

- God is the “father of the fatherless”
- Psalm 68:5 says: “A father of the fatherless, and a judge of the widows, God in his holy habitation.”
- Most of us live to see our father die.
- It hurts to lose your father.
- But we have a loving God, an everlasting father, a “father of the fatherless.”
